Litany for The Passion

Leader: Christ our teacher, for us you were obedient, even unto death.

Voice 1: And going on a little farther, Jesus threw himself on the ground and prayed, *My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want.*

People: Teach us to obey God's will in all things.

Leader: Christ our hope, you were despised and denied, left alone in your hour of need.

Voice 2: After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter, *Certainly you are also one of them, for your accent betrays you.* Then he began to curse, and he swore an oath, *I do not know the man!* At that moment the cock crowed. Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said: *Before the cock crows, you will deny me three times.* And he went out and wept bitterly.

People: Help us stay true to our faith in you.

Leader: Christ our strength, you endured the depths of pain and humiliation at the hands of sinners like us.

Voice 1: Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a reed in his hand and mocked him, saying, *Hail, King of the Jews!*

People: Show us how you conquered not in strength, but in weakness.

Leader: Christ our Savior, on the cross you embraced all time with your outstretched arms.

Voice 2: When they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull) they offered him wine to drink mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots.

People: Teach us the humility by which you saved the world.

Leader: Christ our life, by dying on the cross you destroyed the power of evil and death.

Voice 1: And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?* Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook and the rocks were split.

People: Enable us to die with you, and to rise with you in glory.

Leader: Christ our salvation, you gave your life out of love for us.

Voice 2: Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earth quake and what took place, they were terrified and said, *Truly this man was God's Son!*

People: Help us to love one another.

Leader: Jesus, Lamb of God,

People: Have mercy on us.

Leader: Jesus, bearer of our sins,

People: Have mercy on us.

Leader: Jesus, redeemer of the world,

People: Grant us peace. Amen.
