

FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH PRESENTS THE SUMMER ART GALLERY EXHIBIT BY CENTRAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 4TH GRADE ARTISTS

Ocearch returned to Central for the second consecutive year, bringing their enthusiasm for sharks and highlighting their crucial role in the ocean ecosystem. Fourth-grade students at Central Elementary School read the book, *I Survived The Shark Attacks of 1916*, which provided them with fascinating insights into these magnificent creatures.

Through the lessons, students learned about various aspects of sharks, including their size, diet, and the technology used to track them. They discovered how trackers are applied, what information is gathered, and how they can contribute to the conservation of sharks and their habitats. The artwork created for this exhibit incorporated several methods that sparked creativity among these 4th graders. Newspapers, crayon-watercolor resist, origami and oil pastels were some of the mediums used to design and make these shark images come to life. This expression of their newfound knowledge showcases their understanding and appreciation of sharks and their importance to our oceans.




